but Haywood counties, along with other Americans, have the opportunity to give the finest present of all this Christmas—health. Give this gift by sending in your contribution to Mrs. R. H. Campbell, for the Christmas seals you have received in the mail.

This money is vitally needed to carry on the fight against tuberculosis in Haywood County. The letter enclosed with the seals reads:

"Our efforts toward eradication continue—we ask you again to help. The fact that our death rate from tuberculosis is falling indicates that we are making progress, but the fact that we are finding more cases than ever indicates that there is much to be done.

"In Haywood there are 65 known cases of tuberculosis. Authorities estimate that there is at least one unknown case for each one that is known. These unknown cases are spreading the disease to others. We must find and get them under medical supervision. It is to your advantage to help, since each time we find and get a case under treatment it lessens the chance of you or a member of your family becoming a victim.

"Your tuberculosis committee has used your past contributions in the following ways:

- 1. To bring the mobile X-ray units to Haywood County.

NOTICE OF ORDINANCE PROHIBITING SMOKING IN THEATRES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Waynesville:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to smoke in any theatre building, motion picture house or house of public amusement while patrons are in said building, previous to, during or immediately after any show or gathering for public amusement.

Section 2. Any person violating this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined the sum of FIFTY DOLLARS for each and every offense.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after January 1st, 1954.
