 cut down soot.
 A number of larger cities throughout the country are attempting to combat the problem by organizing smoke-abatement groups, hiring combustion engineers, and passing ordinances to compel property owners to take whatever action is feasible to reduce their soot output.
 Asheville has both a full-time smoke-abatement engineer and a smoke-abatement committee composed of representatives from the city's leading civic clubs.
 Several persons here have suggested that Waynesville might hire some individual—possibly a member of the fire department—on a part-time basis to inspect heating systems and recommend corrective measures whenever incomplete combustion is noted.
 Local civic organizations also could name an advisory group to study the problem.
