Mrs. Dan Cross Entertains With An Informal Tea

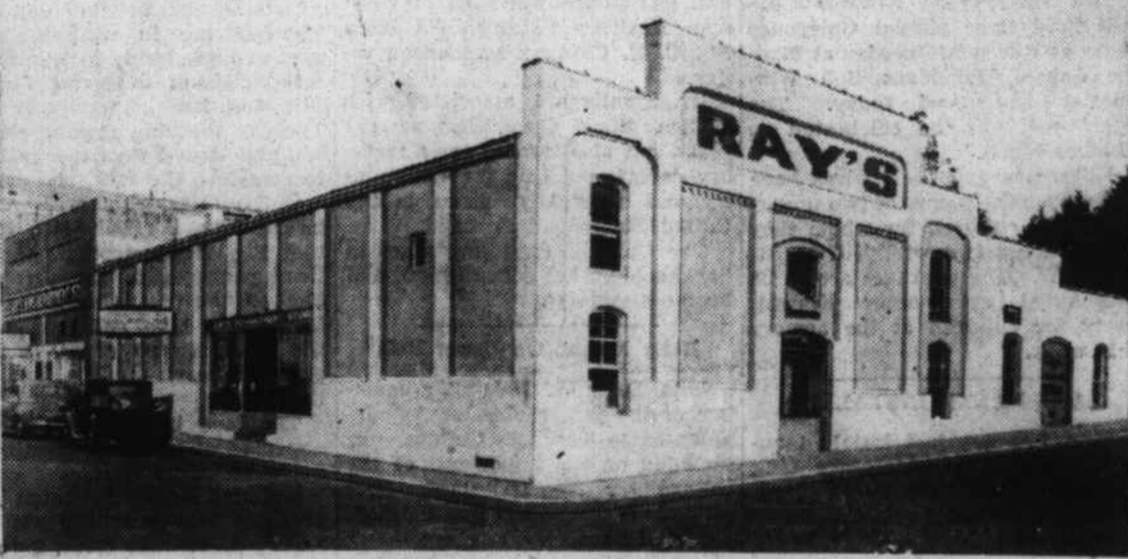
