

Shuford In Line For Head Of Subcommittee

WASHINGTON — Rep. George Shuford is in line for selection as chairman of an important House subcommittee, although he is only second in line in Congress, it is learned today.

Shuford's outlook is that the Asheville lawmaker may be named chairman of the House subcommittee on House Interior and Insular Affairs Committee.

The other Tar Heel secondaries are campaigning for new subcommittee assignments. Shuford is expected to remain on the Insular Affairs subcommittee, because of its importance to his home North Carolina district.

Shuford already has moved up the majority ladder, and as a result of election-year attrition anticipated resignations from the committee may move as high as the majority member this year, he gets that high. Shuford is considered a "natural" for the chairmanship, because he has become in the past year or so a recognized authority in Indian Affairs through his activities in connection with the Cherokee Reservation in his 12th District.

Cathey Has Organization For Polio Drive Complete

Turner Cathey, drive chairman for the 1955 March of Dimes in the Canton-Clyde-Bethel area, began last week organizing his staff of volunteer workers—most of whom have enthusiastically accepted the responsibility year after year.

Citing the fact that "Polio is a bigger job this year" Cathey has told his workers that 70,000 cases already on chapter rolls must be given treatment while vaccine purchases, research, and new epidemics will take millions of dollars more in MOD funds. All in all the amount required is expected to be \$64,000,000.

Named to head the drive in Canton is Pat Greeley. His aide at the Champion Paper and Fibre Co. is J. J. Martin, superintendent of Finishing. Mrs. E. E. Conley heads the Mothers March in Canton again. Mrs. Clyde Wilson and Mrs. Mark Reno will oversee the MOD in the Canton Schools. Other leaders include Carl Gillis, treasurer, and Scott Harvey, Publicity.

In Bethel and West Pigeon John Carver and Garrett Smathers will direct the campaign at the schools. They will also handle special sports events. Mrs. M. C. Nix will head the Mother March there. Sanitation Inspection Rating Listed For County Schools

(EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the first of two articles on sanitation inspections of Haywood County School conducted by sanitarians Bill Milner and Jack Arrington of the Health Department. This article lists the ratings made by the various schools, the second article will cite the deficiencies noted by the inspectors.)

Ratings made by Haywood County Schools and cafeterias today were disclosed by sanitarians Bill Milner and Jack Arrington, who have conducted inspections of the institutions' facilities since the opening of school in the fall.

State law requires that each school be inspected three times during a school term. Several buildings have already been inspected twice.

In a few instances, ratings made by the schools do not reflect conditions there at the present because some unsatisfactory conditions have been corrected since inspections were made.

Mr. Milner and Mr. Arrington stressed that some schools may be in a good state of cleanliness, but may make lower scores because

of the lack of some sanitation facilities.

Following the inspection by the Health Department sanitarians, reports of deficiencies found are made to principals and custodians at the schools.

Separate scores are reported for the school buildings as a whole and for the cafeterias. (The first score listed is for the schools, the second for the cafeteria.)
