> State highway troopers, who individually drive some 4,000 miles a month on duty, are getting safety seat belts for their cars to mini-

mize injuries in case of a smashup. Patrol headquarters said today the sturdy nylon belts would be installed in every one of the 531-car

Studies made in 323 auto accidents last year showed 44 per cent of those injured were flung through doors that popped open on impact.

"This indicates," said patrol commander James R. Smith, "that one of the principle causes of auto injuries comes from being thrown completely clear of the car in a smashup. We are convinced that some potentially fatal injuries to our men might be avoided by use er lane will be maintained of safety belts. ## HAVE YOUR CAR SAFETY CHECKED FREE

#### Here's 10 - Point Auto Safety Check

- Should stop a moving car in 30 feet from 20 miles per hour
- Should take hold evenly on all wheels. Hand brake should be able to hold car under any condition,
- Brake fluid should be kept clean and at proper level.
- With a brake check block, one inch is the minimum allowable floor clearance

#### 2. HEADLIGHTS

- a. Lights should give maximum light for road, minimum glare.
- Both upper and lower beams should be in good warking condition. Lenses should be clean and reflectors bright at all times.

#### 3. REAR AND STOP LIGHTS

- a. All bulbs should burn and all controls operate.
- Lenses must be clean, clear, and free of cracks.
- Reflex reflectors part of stop lights are required in most states and also should be inspected.
- d. Be sure that directional signals also are inspected,

#### 4. TIRES

- a. Proper inflation should be checked.
- Treads and sidewalls should be designated unsafe if worn so that fabric shows through the rubber or if there are any cuts or breaks.
- c. Signs of uneven wear indicate need for rotation and attention to wheel

#### 5. STEERING AND WHEEL ALIGNMENT

- Excessive play in the steering wheel means you need adjustment. Bearings, kingpins, tie-rod'ends and other gear parts should be checked for

#### 6. EXHAUST SYSTEM AND MUFFLER

- Check for rusted or worn parts, leaks that might allow carbon monoxide gas to seep into the car
- b. Check details of complete assembly as required by law.

#### 7. WINDSHIELD WIPERS

- a. Check for dependable operation.
- Blades should be live, flexible rubber that will wipe the glass clean.

#### 8. GLASS

a. Glass should be clean, free of cracks, discoloration,


#### 9. HORN

- a. Should be operating.
- Should be audible for 200 feet, but not so loud as to constitute a nuisance,

#### 10. REAR-VIEW MIRROR

a. Should give clear view of the road behind
