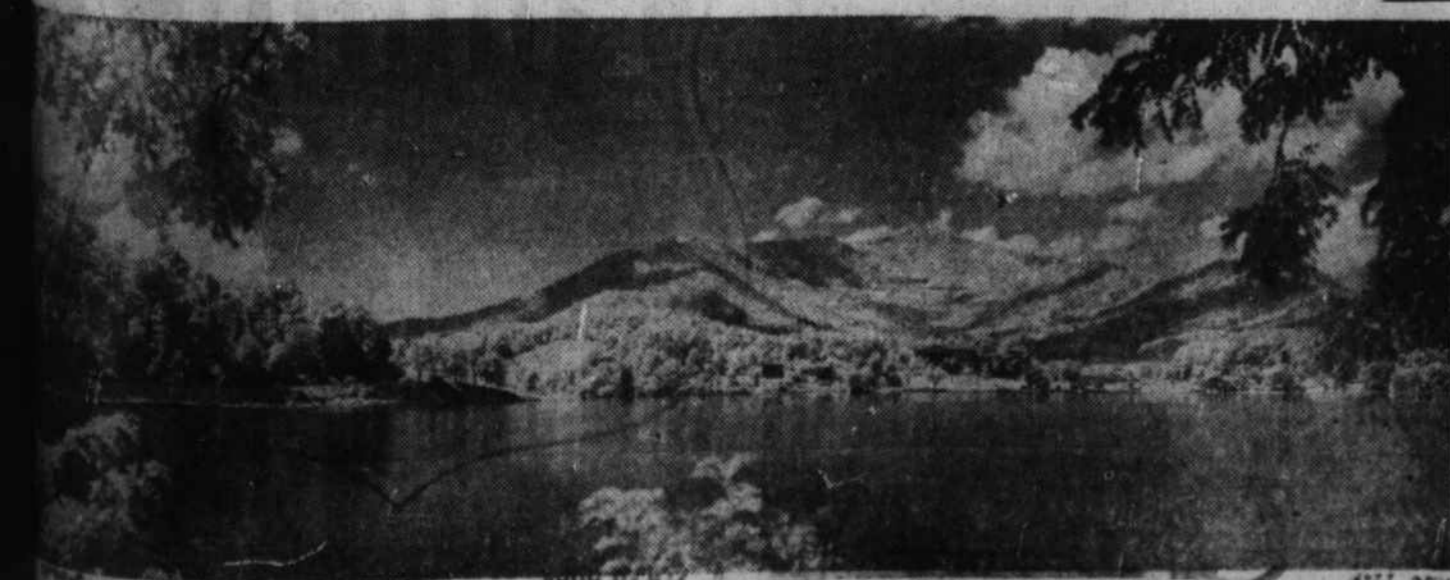

A Western drama, "Strange Lady in Town," starring Greer Garson, Dana Andrews, Cameron Mitchell and Lois Smith, opens Sunday at the Strand Theatre.

Filmed in Cinemascope and WarnerColor by producer-director Mervyn LeRoy for Warner Bros., "Strange Lady in Town" is based upon a story and screenplay by Frank Butler.
