HE SENT HIS SON TO COME TO SAVE THE LOST

*Scripture—Luke 15:1-32.*

MANY publicans and sinners gathered around Jesus to hear Him preach. The Pharisees and scribes criticized Him because, they said, "This man receiveth sinners and eateth with them"—something the orthodox Jew never would do.  
Jesus, reading their thoughts, said: "What man of you, having an hundred sheep, if he lose one of them, doth not leave the ninety and nine in the wilderness, and go after that which is lost until he find it?"  
Then he would call his friends and ask them to rejoice with him, for he had found the lost one.  
"I say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance."

The father did so, and the younger son took all he possessed and went on a journey into a faraway country, where he squandered all he had in riotous living.
