## ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

Under the leadership of Virgil Holloway, County Agent, Miss Mary Cornwell, Home Agent, and John Carver, Division Chairman, with other agencies cooperating, these things were done:

1. The annual out-of-state farm tour was resumed.

2. Enabling legislation to provide tax money for building the Livestock Show and Home Arts Building was passed.

3. Several farm conferences and one day educational conferences were held for discussing and hearing discussed various phases of the County's agricultural program.

4. An experimental Christmas Tree project of 1,000 trees was established as a source of future farm income in cooperation with the soil conservation program.

5. The annual Haywood County Tobacco Harvest Festival was reorganized and staged.
