He pitched last winter la Cuba and it was there that St. Louis manager Fred Hutchinson suggested he try changing speeds on his curve ball,


"It worked good," says Mizell, a native of Vinegar Bend, Ala "But up here in the big leagues I don't know, I may have to put the pitch back in my pocket."


