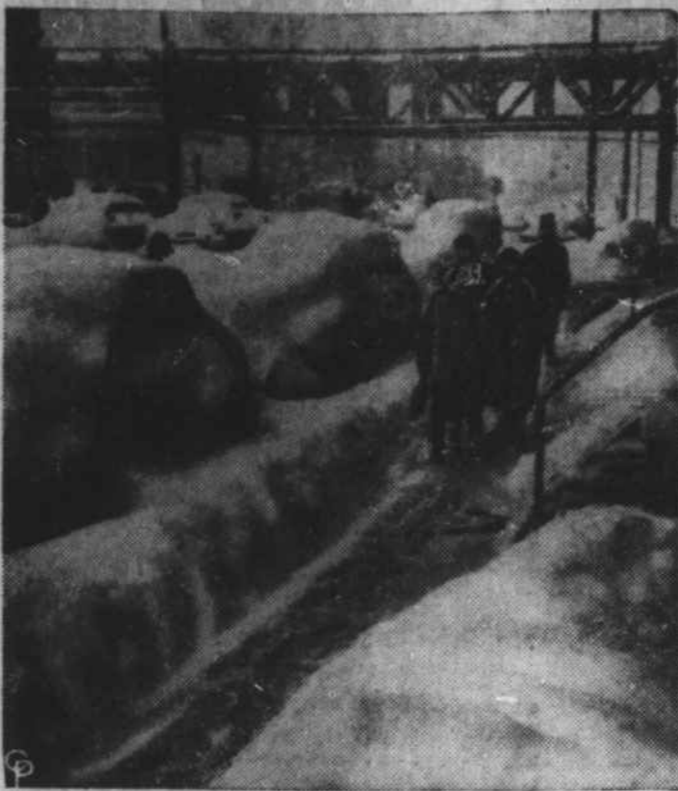

Even so, we have never believed that capital punishment has acted as a deterrent to crime, either today or in the past. Evidence in other countries and in other eras casts doubt on the theory that the threat of capital punishment serves as a restraint on criminals.

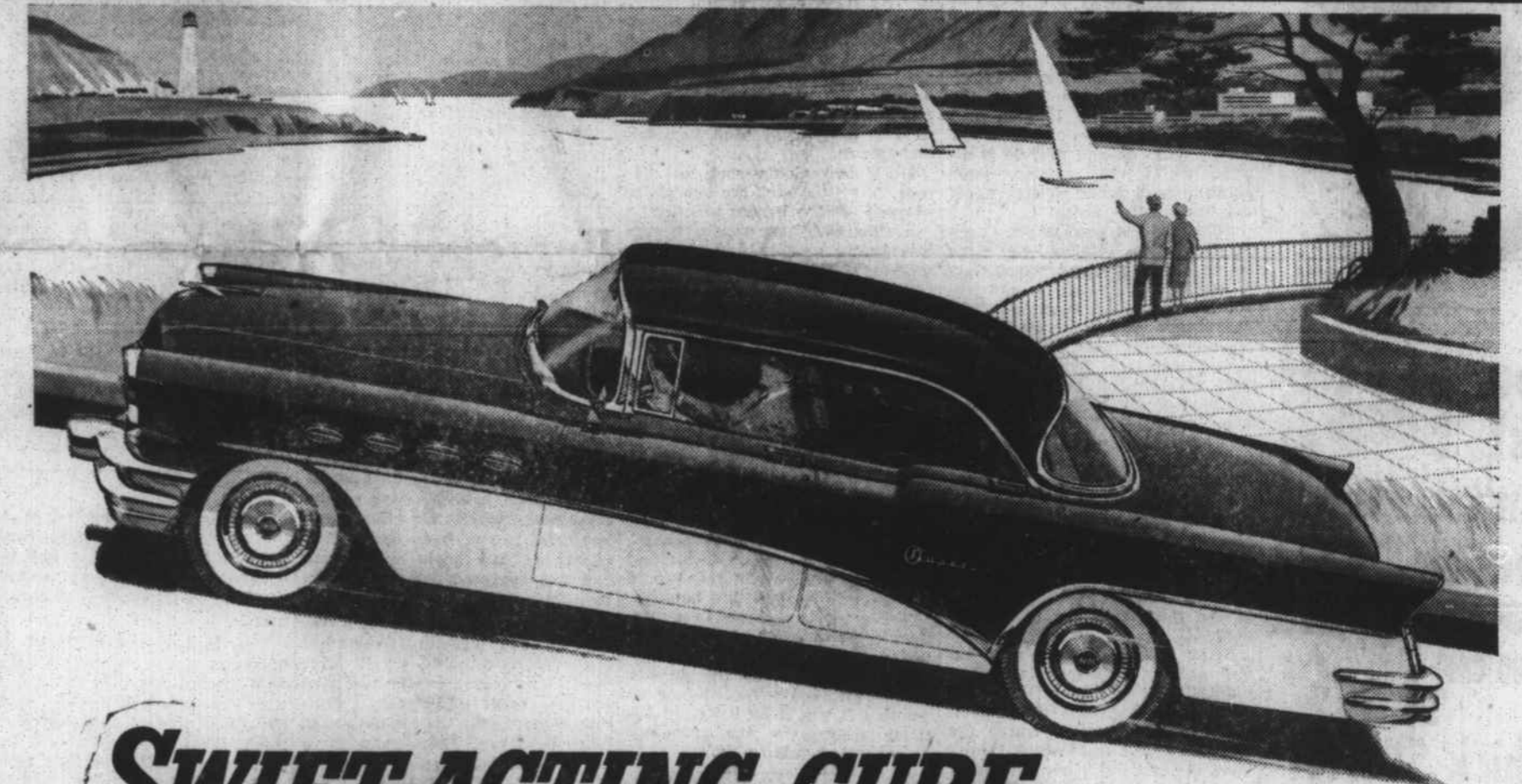
