

Junaluska Will Open For Fishing Monday, April 2

Tests Show Many Fish In The Lake

Fishermen, here is the news you have been waiting to hear.

Lake Junaluska waters will be opened to fishing Monday, April 2.

The announcement came this morning from J. W. Fowler, Jr., superintendent of the Lake.

Members of the State Wildlife and Resources Commission recently made a test of the fish life in the 250-acre lake and announced that it is ready for the fishermen to take over.

There are bass, bream and crappie in the lake, and according to the recent check, they are present in large numbers.

The lake is being opened earlier than was first expected would be possible.

The re-stocking program of about 12 months ago, plus the fact that the waters of the lake were closed to fishing last year, gave time for the fish population to grow to such a size as to permit fishing.

All fishermen will be required to have a state and county license and in addition, a permit from the lake. The season lake permits are \$7.50 while the daily permit is 50 cents.

Supt. Fowler said that Police Chief Everett McElroy and State Protector Williams would be on hand Monday to issue permits to fishermen.

Last year the lake went to considerable expense to rid the body of water of carp, a rough fish. The lake was drained and all game fish were put into a pool until the clearance of carp had been completed. Many of the bass returned to the waters were 12 inches long.

Whites Win All-Star Game, 81-77; WTHS' Don Jordan Paces Blue Cagers

A team of "Whites," composed of Buncombe County seniors, scored their first victory in the four-year-old All-Star basketball game at Enka by trimming the "Blues" from four other WNC counties, 81-77.

On the Blue squad were outstanding senior cagers from Haywood, Henderson, Transylvania, and Madison counties.

Leading scorer for the Blues was Don Jordan, captain of the Waynesville High quintet this year, who threw in 15 points, Top man for the

White and the game's high scorer was Larry Daves of Enka, who netted 21.

Coach Bill Swift of Waynesville coached the Blues; Bill Williams of Leicester, piloted the Whites. The Blue basketeers jumped off to an early lead in the front quarter and it was not until Scott Conner's basket in the last 10 seconds of the period that the White gained command. However, they never again gave up the lead.

The count at the half was 40-30. In the third quarter, Jordan and David Anderson of Canton combined forces to close the gap to 60-55 at the end of the period. In the final period, the Blues narrowed the lead down to two points at 66-64, but Jack Benfield of Reynolds and Jackie Teague of Leicester led a White surge that put the game on ice.

Other leading scorers for the Blues were Anderson and Bill Davis of Hendersonville with 12 each.

Davis was selected as the game's outstanding player—an honor gained last year by Joe Aldridge of Waynesville.
