Added Funds Held Needed To Avert Crisis In Schools

The crisis developing in Haywood County public schools can be cured only by additional funds, according to Lawrence Leatherwood, superintendent of schools, who spoke to the Waynesville Business and Professional Women's Club Tuesday night at Davis Chapel in Iron Duff.

A fast growing school population has already swamped available facilities, creating a shortage of class rooms and inadequate maintenance services, a situation which will grow steadily worse, Supt. Leatherwood said. Federal funds, re-evaluation of taxable property, or a bond issue were suggested as possibilities for meeting the school crisis, and a citizens committee to study the problem was recommended.

The Health, Safety and Education committee of the club, Mrs. Lura Davis, chairman, was in charge of the program.
