Pet Milk Company officials have announced the purchase of properties in Fresno, Calif., formerly occupied by the Channel Bakers and Walter C. Hanson and Son, fruit processors.

Baking activities have been discontinued and the facilities of the bakery are being remodeled for use in manufacturing frozen processed foods. It is contemplated that the fruit processing plant will be operated seasonally.

Operations will be under the Company's Pet-Ritz Foods Division, which has headquarters and another frozen food plant in Frankfort, Mich.

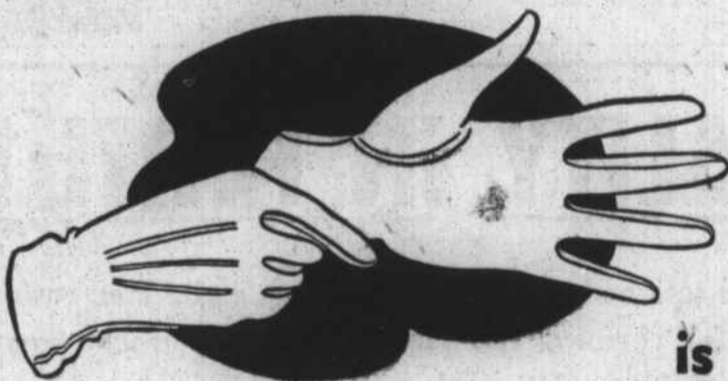
