The week of April 22-28 has been set by the National Security Committee as "Military Reserve Week" and its purpose is to focus attention on the six-month reserve training program. Personnel of the National Guard may volunteer for this six-month period of training at a regular army post if they have enlisted in the National Guard before they are 18 1/2 years of age or if they are in school, they can elect to wait until graduation or age 20 to volunteer. By volunteering, young men can chop three years off their military obligation. However, if a young man upon graduation desires to go to college or obtains employment at home, he can still complete his military obligation through satisfactory service in the National Guard by serving until he reaches the age of 28. Anyone desiring further information on this program may call the National Guard Armory GL 6-3312 or if they care to visit the Armory it will be open Wednesday and Thursday, nights from 7 to 9 p.m.
