Mrs. Y. F. Burgess Contributes To Botany Research

Mrs. Y. F. Burgess, biology teacher at Waynesville High School, has submitted three botanical specimens from Haywood County for inclusion in a new book, "Flora of the Carolinas," now being prepared by the University of North Carolina botany department.

Mrs. Burgess sent to UNC specimens of climbing fern, Christmas fern, and trailing arbutus. She said that the climbing fern is rare in the mountain area, but somewhat abundant in Eastern North Carolina. She added that the trailing arbutus was once abundant in the state, but is now becoming extinct.

In a letter to biology teachers in North and South Carolina, Dr. H. R. Totten of the university's botany department wrote: "It has been estimated that in coastal plain, Piedmont, and mountains of this area, nearly 5,000 specimens of plants are growing naturally. Not within the last 100 years has a three trophies!
