Now, therefore, acting under the authority contained in Chapter 115, Paragraph 86 of the General Statutes of North Carolina and a resolution duly adopted by the Board of Education, the undersigned Chairman and Secretary of said Board of Education will offer for sale at public auction for cash upon an opening bid of Two thousand seven hundred and eighty dollars (\$2,780.00) at the Courthouse door at 11:00 A.M. on the 15th day of May, 1956, in the Town of Waynesville, a certain parcel of land in Cecil Township, Haywood County, described as follows:
