

1st Lamb Pool Planned May 25 At Clyde Yards

The county's first lamb pool of 1956 will be held at the Clyde stockyards Friday, May 25, according to Albert L. Ramsey, assistant farm agent.

All producers who plan to consign lambs for the pool are urged to notify the county agent's office not later than May 19 to permit the making of arrangements for railway transportation. Lambs not consigned by that date may not be accepted at the pool.

Mr. Ramsey advised farmers to sell all lambs weighing 85 pounds and more.

Stock must arrive at the Clyde stockyards between 7 and 10 a.m. on the day of the sale.
