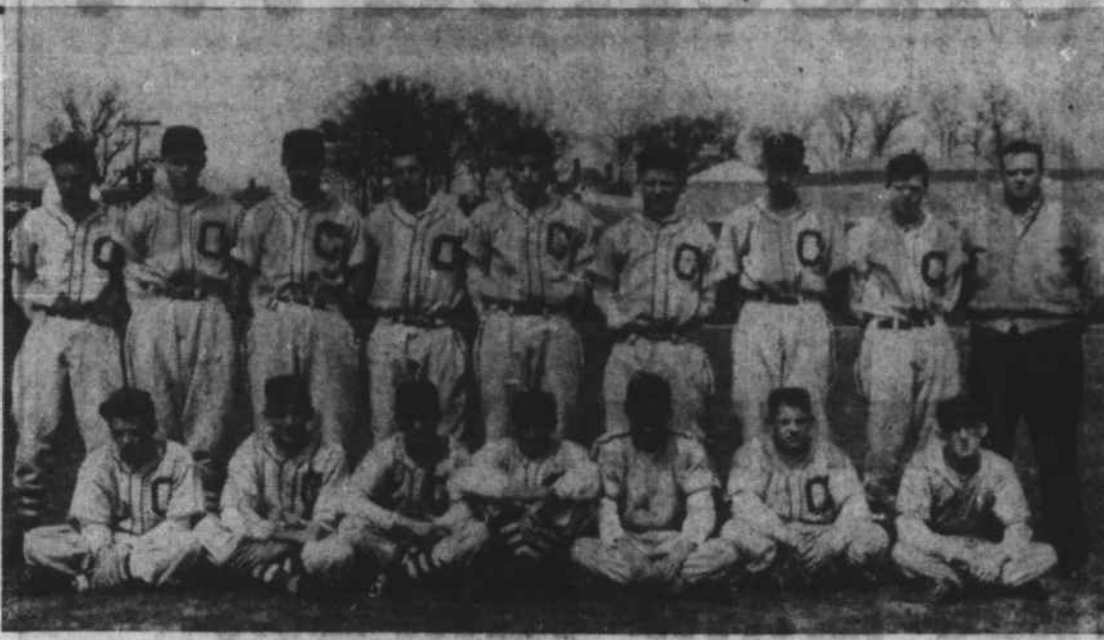


# Champion Extends Softball Streak To 10 With Two Wins At Oak Ridge

In the fourth inning, Moore walked, went to second when Ivester walked, and then scored on Mease's double.

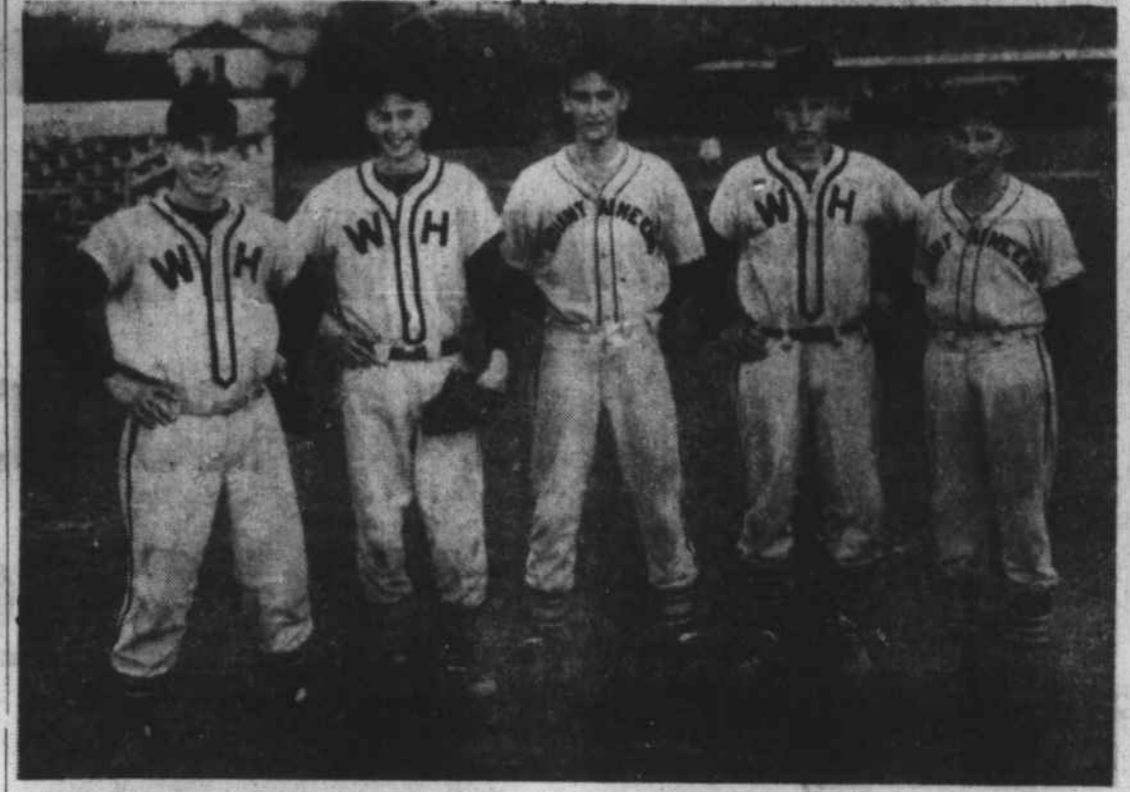
Champion put three more runs

For the second straight time Jupiter Pluvius stepped in to halt the second baseball game between the Waynesville Mountaineers and the Canton Black Bears.

Originally scheduled for last Friday, the game was first postponed until today and then was set back again until this Wednesday afternoon.

The two county rivals met for the first time this season on Friday, April 27, and the Mountaineers handed the Black Bears their first loss of the season, 11-9.
