

### Elks Camp Set For 12th Season At Hendersonville

The 12th season for the North Carolina Elks Camp for Boys near Hendersonville will begin June 17, according to an announcement by Boyce Whitmire Sr., camp director.

Whitmire indicated that the camp has to date played host to some 5,500 boys during its existence and that this year some 615 boys, representing all the lodges in the state will attend the camping periods.

Opening the season will be a delegation of deserving youngsters from Asheville, Brevard, Hendersonville, Morganton, Shelby, North, Wilkesboro and Waynesville and the groups will arrive on Sunday, June 17, to stay until July 1; when the second camping period begins.

Other camping periods and lodges to be represented are:

July 1-15: Gastonia, High Point, Hickory, Mooresville, Winston-Salem, Salisbury.

July 15-29: Asheville, Burlington, Charlotte, Durham, Greensboro, Raleigh, Reidsville.

July 29-Aug. 12: Elizabeth City, Fayetteville, Goldsboro, Henderson, Greenville, Kinston, Lumberton, Morehead City, Rocky Mount, New Bern, Sanford, Washington, Southern Pines, Wilmington and Wilson.

Some personnel changes have been announced but oldsters on the staff are also returning for

the summer sessions. Whitmire will serve as camp director and Ted Carter, basketball coach at Gastonia high school and former cage coach at Hendersonville high school, will be assistant camp director. Ernest Justice, Flat Rock principal, will serve as a senior counselor instructing in crafts. Bob Tate, Hendersonville high school coach, returns as waterfront director, and Bob Armstrong, who has served the camp as a counselor for several seasons, will again return. He is now serving as coach at Elberton, Ga., high school.

A new senior counselor will be Carol Hambright, former Greenville Y. M. C. A. and Mecklenburg Fresh Air Camp executive and now assistant grid coach and head swimming coach at Davidson College. Another senior counselor will be Shannon Herring, now doing postgraduate work in recreation at Oklahoma University, will join the camp staff.

Malcolm Bridges of Gastonia schools will rejoin the staff this summer as a senior counselor.

Two Hendersonville men are on the staff this year, these being Tommy Williams and Willett Bennett, who have served the camp in the past.

Junior counselors will be Richard Moore of Blue Ridge School, from Maryland; Cecil and Bobby Smith of Elberton, Ga.; Tom Cobe of Brevard; John Corl of Gold Hill, N. C.; Grady Jackson of Gastonia, and two others yet to be selected.

### Sinatra Portrays A Drug Addict In Unusual Film

"The Man With The Golden Arm," a United Artists release which has its local premiere Sunday at the Strand Theatre is a bold and courageous film, dealing as it does with an untouchable theme (a man's fight against drug addiction), but even more important it makes for top-notch movie entertainment.

Starring Frank Sinatra, Eleanor Parker and Kim Novak in a taut movie version of Nelson Algren's challenging National Book Award novel of the same name, the picture combines sterling performances, superb direction on the part of Otto Preminger (who also produced) and a story that mounts steadily in interest from the first frame to the last.

Frank Sinatra, who, since "From Here to Eternity" has come through with one great performance after another, achieves perfection with his interpretation of Frankie Machine, gambler and drug addict, determined to fight both, but fighting against greater odds than he ever faced at the card table. Sinatra realistically brings to the fore everything that one knows Frankie Machine would face; uncertainty, weakness, fatigue, and despair.
