Saul (called Paul) and Barnabas, at Paphos found a sorcerer who was trying to keep his companion, deputy Sergius Paulus, from becoming a Christian. Chiding him severely, Paul caused him to become blind.

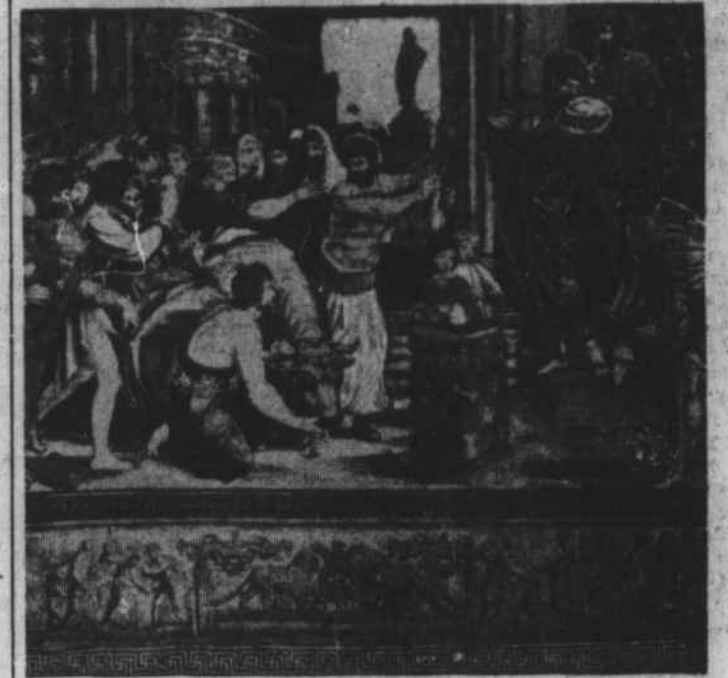
In the synagogue in Antioch, Pisidia, the apostles were asked if they had any words of exhortation for the people. Paul's words pleased his hearers. The next Sabbath all the city came to hear him.

At Lystra, Asia Minor, the apostles found a man who had been lame from birth, unable to use his impotent feet. Paul called loudly to him to stand up. The lame man did, then he leaped and walked.

Paul settled an argument in Jerusalem as to whether Gentiles should become as Jews to be Christians. A letter sent to Antioch, saying they need not be, caused great joy.
