Local Sergeant Reassigned; Was California Flood Hero

BEALE AIR FORCE BASE, Calif. —Master Sergeant Oliver W. Franklin, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harkin Franklin, Rt. 2, Waynesville, has been re-assigned to the Far East Command due to the world wide inactivation of the Aviation Engineer Force of which he was a member. Prior to this re-assignment, Franklin was a member of the 136th Engineer Aviation Brigade located at Beale Air Force Base, Calif.

While stationed at Beale with the 136th Brigade, Sgt. Franklin acted as Field First Sergeant for Headquarters Company and as Administrative Supervisor in the Engineering Section for a period of thirteen months. Previous assignments were with the 3420th Army Service Unit at Fort Bragg.

He entered the service in September 1940 as a Staff Sergeant from the 120th Infantry, a National Guard Unit from Waynesville. Franklin received his reserve commission by virtue of a direct appointment to Second Lieutenant in 1941 and was promoted to the grade of Captain in August 1943. Separated from the service in 1946, he was recalled to active duty in 1950 as a captain. He was separated again from the service in January 1954 and enlisted in the Regular Army the next day as a Sergeant First Class. He was promoted to his present rank of Master Sergeant in January 1956.

Sergeant Franklin's varied assignments have carried him across both oceans, serving in Europe, Korea and in Japan.
