

Champion Softballers Take Three Out Of Four From Atlantic Champions

Canton Team Home Again This Week

Champion Y's softballers continued their winning ways last weekend by taking three out of four games from the visiting Trenton Democratic Club of Baltimore, Md., the No. 3 team in last year's World Tournament and perennial champions of the Central Atlantic region.

The Marylanders took the first tilt, 1-0, handing Wade Garrett his first loss of the season, but the Champion squad came back to capture the nightcap, 2-1, and sweep the Saturday night doubleheader, 12-1, and 4-0.

In the first game Friday, both teams got only four hits, but a homer by Jacobs in the ninth inning spelled the difference in the hard fought game. Although charged with the loss, Garrett fanned 13 opponents, while the Trenton hurler, Hemphill, struck out only six.

In the bottom half of the double feature Friday, veteran Nazi Miller scattered four Trenton hits while Champion was getting seven off the visitors' hurler, Wiles. Miller struck out nine; Wiles six.

Champion scored its first run as Poindexter doubled, advanced on Holcomb's sacrifice and then scored on the third baseman's error. The Carolinians added one more in the sixth inning as Ivester doubled and came home on Clyde Miller's single.

In the opener Saturday night, Champion Y shelled Wiles for 13 hits, while Nazi Miller was holding Trenton batters to only four safeties. The visitors also committed seven errors during the fray.

Leading hitters were Stamey with a round tripper and Holcomb, Poindexter, and Moore with two doubles apiece.

In the second game Saturday night, both teams again only got four hits but four errors by Trenton fielders hurt their team's chances.

In the tilt, Garrett won for Champion, whiffing eight men, while the losing pitcher, Hemphill, struck out five.

Clyde Miller led the Y squad with two doubles.

Champion will be home again this weekend, meeting Mooresville Mills in a doubleheader Friday night and Layfield Motors of Atlanta in two games Saturday night.

The Hazelwood Lions team got off to a good start in the WNC Junior Industrial League here this morning by stopping Martel Mills, 7-1, on the WTHS diamond.

Bobby Trull played a prominent part in the opening victory by limiting the visitors to only two hits during the game.

Bobby, a rising sophomore at WTHS, got into hot water in the seventh inning, but he got out of the crisis unaided by striking out the next three men in a row. He had a total of seven strikeouts during the contest.

Leading hitter for Hazelwood was Jack Holder, who got three hits in four trips to the plate—including one triple. Mike Byrd got a triple and a double and Stuart Scruggs and James Carver each hit two singles apiece.

Hamlin started on the mound for Martel, but was relieved in the fifth inning by Taylor.

Hazelwood committed only one error; Martel was charged with three.

The locals tallied three runs in the first inning as Burrell singled, Byrd doubled, Holder got on on the catcher's error, and Carver singled.

Two more Hazelwood runs crossed the plate in the third inning as Holder and Carver singled, Carswell walked, and Bobby Green hit a liner through the shortstop, scoring Holder and Carver.

Hazelwood added two more in the fourth inning as Scruggs singled and scored on Byrd's triple. Holder then sent Byrd home with another triple.

Rock Powers, manager of the Hazelwood team, praised his squad for playing "a good game in the field." He singled out Scruggs for his play at third base, and complemented Carswell for his running catch of a fly in left field. He also lauded Trull for his two-hitter, commenting: "He was in control all the way."

Hazelwood will go to Martel Thursday morning for another Junior Industrial League game. Holder is expected to pitch for the locals.

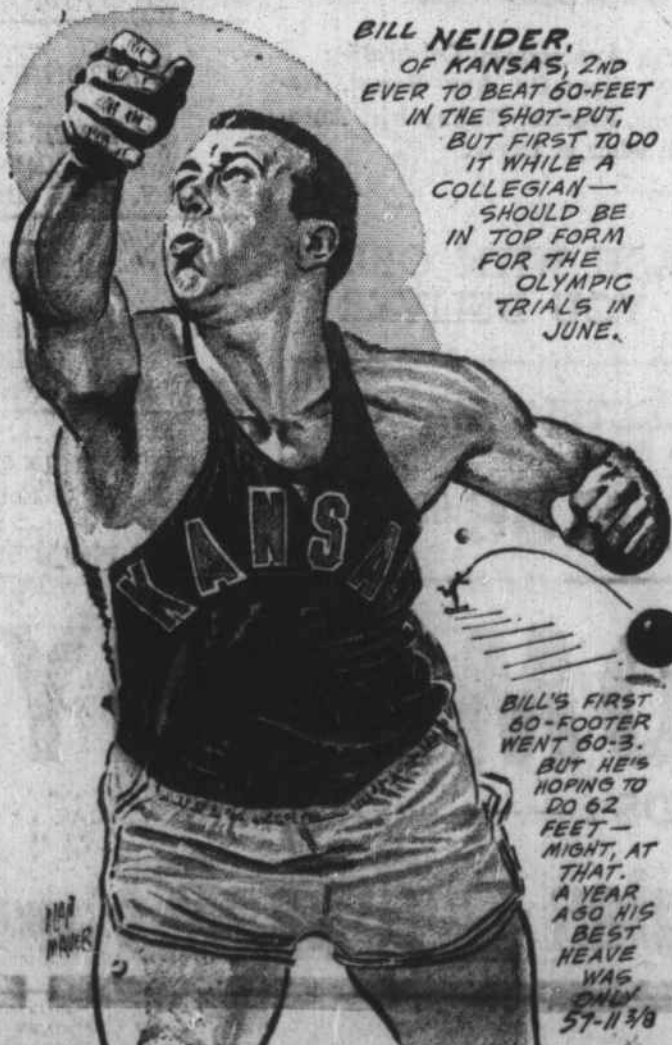
