Truck Lighting Regulations Listed By Highway Patrol

In response to a number of inquiries, Cpl. Pritchard H. Smith of the State Highway Patrol has filed the following information on lighting equipment required on trucks and buses:

Every truck and bus, whatever its size, must have two red reflectors (one on each side) and one tail light and stop light (this may be a combination tail and stop light).

Turn signals are required on trucks and buses when the distance from the center of the top of the steering post to the left outside limit of the body, cab or load of such motor vehicle exceeds twenty four (24) inches, or when the distance from the center of the top of the steering post to the rear limit of the body or load exceeds fourteen (14) feet.

Clearance lights are required on every bus or truck 80 inches or more in overall width.

Two clearance lamps (one on each side) are required on the front, the rear, and on each side. Two reflectors also are required on each side, one near the front and one near the rear. All lamps and reflectors near the front should be amber or yellow, and all lamps and reflectors on the rear shall be red.

Every truck tractor must have two head lights, two clearance lamps on the front (one at each side) and one stop light and one tail light on the rear.

Every trailer or semi-trailer having a gross weight in excess of 3,000 pounds must have:

1. On the front—two clearance lamps—one at each side.
2. On the side — two marker lamps—one at or near the front and one at or near the rear.
3. On the rear—two clearance

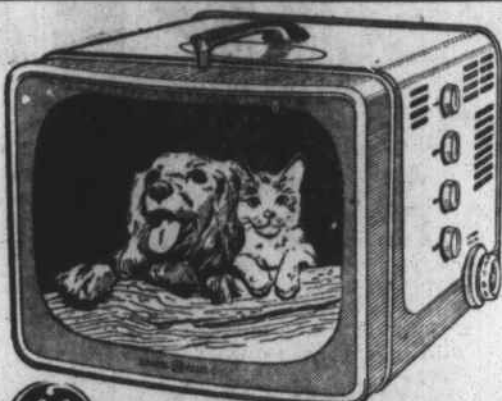
4. One stop light and one tail light. This may be a three-way combination light; tail light, stop light and white light to light up license.
