When Paul entered the temple some Jews were enraged, forcing him out. They stirred up the people and beat him. Roman soldiers interfered, taking him to the castle.



On the steps of the castle Paul asked to be allowed to speak to the infuriated mob. He told of his nationality and background, and then recited the story of his conversion.
