Miss Tucker is a native North Carolinian, now an advanced student of percussion instruments at the University of Illinois.

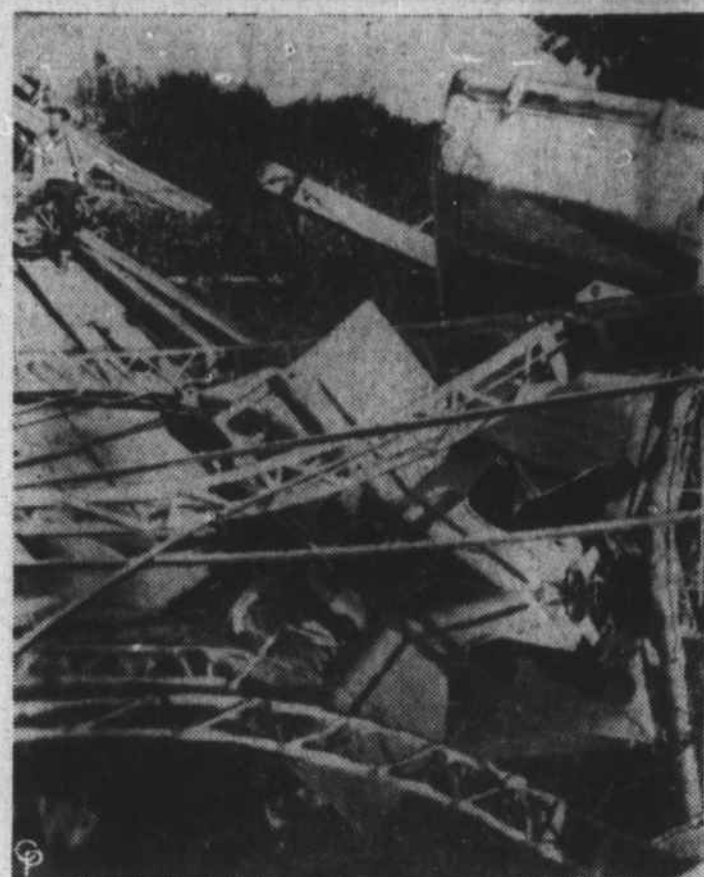
Miller is a graduate of the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, and plays professionally in Philadelphia.

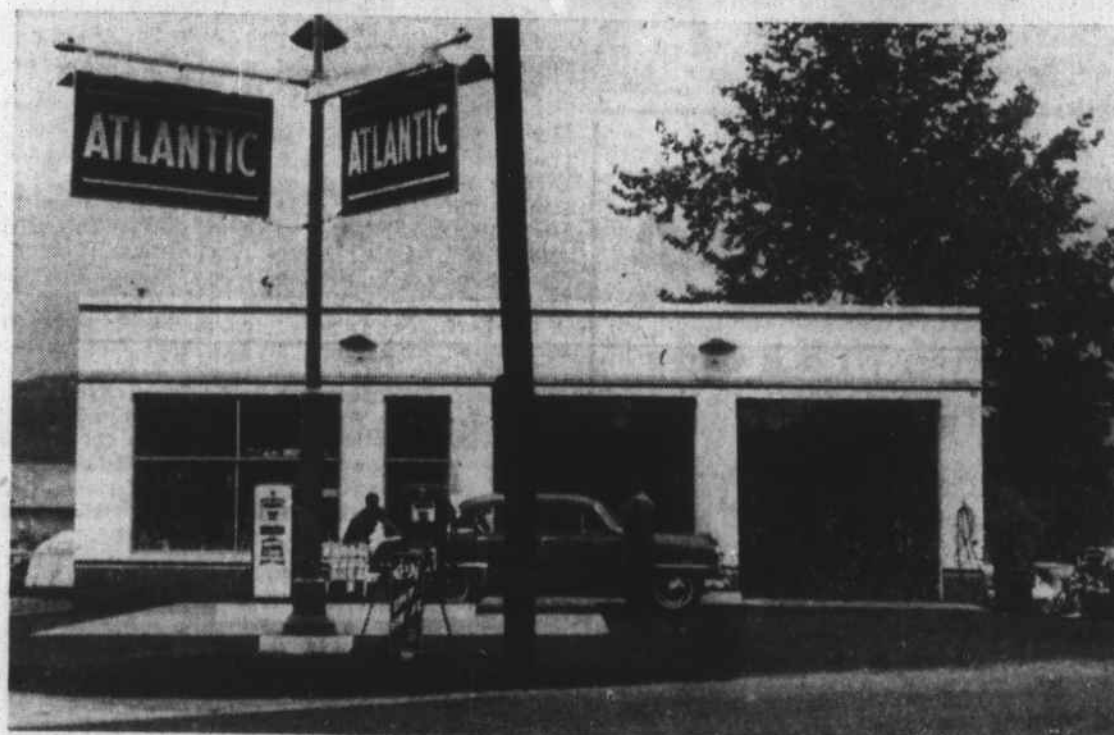
