Swim Classes At Junaluska Begin Monday

Swimming lessons at the Lake Junaluska pool will begin Monday, June 25, according to Wallace Martin, director of recreation for the assembly. Classes will begin at 9 and run until 10:30 each morning. During this time the pool will be closed to the public.

The swimming course will offer classes for beginning swimmers, intermediate swimmers, and junior and senior life saving if enough people request them. The course will satisfy both boy and girl scout requirements for merit badges, and

Red Cross certificates will be issued at the completion of the course.

Each student must have a minimum of ten hours of class instruction during each two-week course. A course begins anew every two weeks; this procedure will be followed until the first of September.

Preference for the swimming courses will be given to people who were enrolled last year. Persons living off the assembly grounds—in Waynesville, Hazelwood and surrounding areas—are invited to participate in the program, which will be under the supervision of qualified Red Cross instructors.

Johnny Ellington of Emory University; Richard Beauchamp of

Nashville, Tenn.; Carolyn Thornton from Kentucky (beginners); and Tommy Geitzell of Chattanooga, Fla., all life guards at the pool, will conduct the classes.

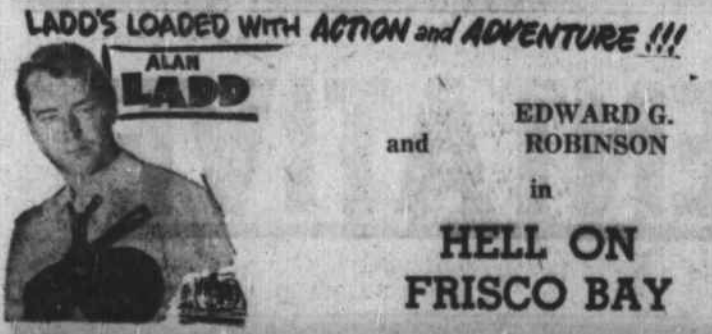
