The following films are now available at the Haywood County Public Library:

Action Against The Law (TFC) 28 minutes - sound - black and white. In this film a series of minor incidents aggravated by intergroup frictions results in an ugly crisis as misguided citizens resort to mob violence.

Art and Life in Italy (Coronet) 10 minutes - sound - color. The art of Italy is shown as the result of activities of the Italian people in the land in which they live.

Camouflage in Nature Through Form and Color Matching (Coronet) 10 minutes - sound - black and white. Demonstrates that coloration, resemblance and mimicry protect living things.

Canada's New Farm Lands (UWF) 20 minutes - sound - black and white. The principles which govern the development of new frontiers are clearly set forth in this picture.
