A million-dollar Protestant center for training career workers in the government's foreign service will be built in Washington by the Methodist Church.

Dr. Hurst M. Anderson, president of American University in Washington, said the new School of International Service will be located on the university campus. American University is a Methodist institution with an enrollment of more than 5,000 students.

Addressing a Southwide Methodist missionary conference at Lake Junaluska, Dr. Anderson said "America's new leadership in world affairs is accompanied by responsibilities for which we are not prepared."

The Methodist Church's General Conference, top policy-making body, has authorized \$1,000,000 to establish the school, Dr. Anderson said.

Dr. Anderson emphasized the need "for Protestants to take the lead in restoring Christian principles in our government and culture," and warned that "if we don't, the influence will come from an authoritarian-type church."

The appropriation stipulated, Dr. Anderson said, that "the School of International Service shall be regarded as an institution of the entire Church, established by the Church as a basic contribution to religious liberty and to the maintenance of the Protestant tradition of freedom throughout the world."

The international situation today compels Americans "to face problems undreamed of 25 years ago," Dr. Anderson said. "If we are to demonstrate our cherished American principles to the people of other nations, then we must understand our own cultural inheritance. It will not perpetuate itself automatically, and we lose it overnight."

Dr. Anderson said that his travels to Europe and the Middle East had convinced him that many foreign leaders "are puzzled and confused by Americans who appear to worship materialism and Christ at the same time, and who know so little about America's democratic culture."
