thorized construction funds for the first three years of a projected 13-year highway program.

The matching basis on Interstate funds was also changed from 60-40 (60 per cent federal funds plus 40 per cent State funds) to 90-10. The Federal Government puts up 90 per cent and the State puts up 10 per cent. Governor Hodges recently made the State's 10 per cent, \$2.8 million, available out of highway surplus funds.

Out of a total of \$28,325,730 available from Federal-State Interstate funds, the Federal allocation is \$25,493,157 while the State matching funds are \$2,832,573. Graham allocated \$28.2 million to 17 specific Interstate projects, leaving a reserve or balance of \$125,-730 for emergencies and contingences.

Graham emphasized that the projects were selected on the basis of sound engineering recommendations and of statewide need. "In most cases." he said, "the most obsolete and heavily-traveled sections of the Interstate system were selected. The portions with the greatest need of improvement were chosen to receive the first roadbuilding relief."




