

Under the changes, the lines previously used "Passes attempted" and "Passes completed" will be combined into a single line, "Passes" thus:

East West 7-9 1-2

The second change deals with punts. Instead of number of punts in one and punting average in another, the single line will be headed "punts" and read 4-40.5: which will mean there were 4 punts, with an average of
