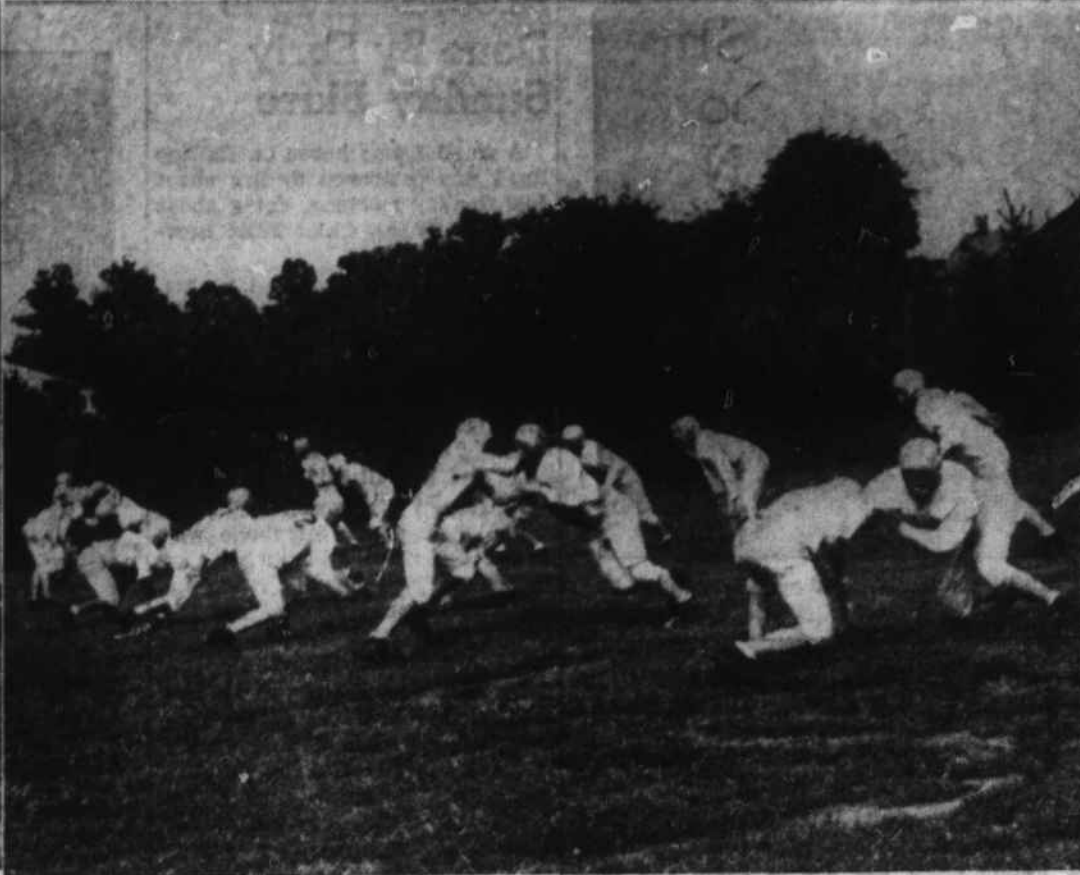




HIT 'EM LOW and go, is what these hard working linemen heard from Coach Jaynes, on the sled, as they went through workouts. (Mountaineer Photos).

Football Box Statistics To Have New Style

Readers of sports pages this fall will find a new style in the football statistics. All wire services and sports editors have agreed to the uniform style which will cut out two lines from each statistic box, yet will give all the information as heretofore.

Under the changes, the lines previously used "Passes attempted" and "Passes completed" will be combined into a single line, "Passes" thus:

	East	West
Passes	7-9	1-2

That will mean that the East completed 7 out of 9 passes while the West completed 1 out of 2 attempted.

The second change deals with punts. Instead of number of punts in one and punting average in another, the single line will be headed "punts" and read 4-40.5; which will mean there were 4 punts, with an average of 40.5 yards.

All of this is designed for easier reading and understanding on the part of the readers.

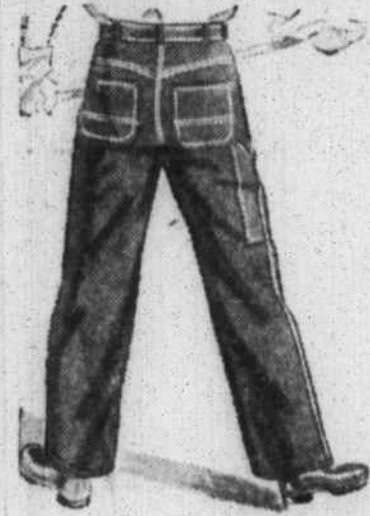
Champion Mills In Victory Over Minette

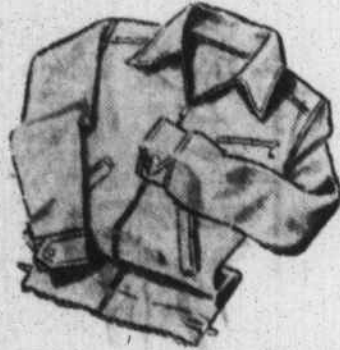
