Lake Speaker Warns U. S. Of Communistic Trends In Both Africa And Asia

Dr. Frank C. Laubach, prominent Methodist missionary and linguist, told a large Lake Junaluska congregation that "in the next 5 years Asia and Africa will go over to Communism unless the church helps the people. And if that happens, in the next 10 years we'll be gone."

Dr. Laubach, long considered one of the foremost literary specialists, has assisted missions and governments around the globe to

start campaigns against illiteracy. He is thought of by many as one of the best authorities on both the Near and Far East by virtue of his extended work there.

Dr. Laubach stated that "the hungry masses . . . are becoming dangerous" toward the Western world, "partly because of the Communists and because of our own indifference" toward them.

He told his audience that "we are still losing in Asia . . . we're bewildered in this country . . . we

don't know what's going on so we're losing the world."

The prominent Methodist pleaded with his congregation that America "try Christ. Let's stop using bombs," he said.

He told his audience that "the vast multitudes of the world have stopped reaching down and are reaching up and saying who'll take my hand."

Dr. Laubach pointed out that "the masses turn to Communism because we won't help them."

He said that "the first attack in this new advance is going to be prayer."

Dr. Laubach requested that the ministers go home "and teach your people not to pray just for themselves but for the whole world, too."

He told the congregation that "prayer is the mightiest power in the world."

Dr. Laubach said that "if we'd send \$5 abroad for every \$1 we spent here in missions, we could win the world."
