Mrs. Frank Riley of the local telephone office gave a lecture-demonstration entitled "Put Your Best Voice Forward," Tuesday evening at a meeting of Circle 5 of the First Methodist Church. The meeting was held in the home of Mrs. Erwin Burgin.

Mrs. Riley's demonstration was in the form of an educational program emphasizing good telephone usage. She played a series of voice types on a tape recorder to show how the sound of a voice over the telephone is associated with the mental image of how the listener believes a person looks. She illustrated each voice with an exaggerated comic cartoon and gave suggestions for corrective exercises.

The members heard recordings of their own voices on a voice mirror, a device which reproduces the sound exactly as it is heard over the telephone.
