In 1853 when Commodore Perry landed in Japan with his U. S. fleet the Oriental country became opened permanently to trade and other relations with the Western nations, he added,

Rev. Mr. Shimmi said that Japan has adopted, to a large extent, many things from the West's way of life, such as food, clothing, household furnishings and appliances, and transportation

Today ,he pointed out, about 80 per cent of all Japanese wear Western clothing.

Commenting on religion, the speaker said that Japan's two major religions are Buddhism and Shintoism (ancestor worship).

Speaking of his personal life, Rev. Mr. Shimmi related how he was drafted into the Japanese army in World War II while a seminary student, spending two years in service. During all this time, he said, his every word and action were under constant scrutiny because he was believed pro-West-

Since the war, the speaker remarked, 'Japan has become completely free, and is on its way to recovery."

"However," he added, "the future is not in our hands; it is in yours. It will be up to the United


