LITTLE CHILDREN AND ALL HUMAN BEINGS MAY OPEN THEIR HEARTS TO CHRIST

Scripture—Mark 10:13-16; Revelation 3:20; 21:1—22:21.

childhood? Did they become His disciples? We cannot know, but of all the stories in the Scriptures of our Lord's life, this is one of the loveliest.

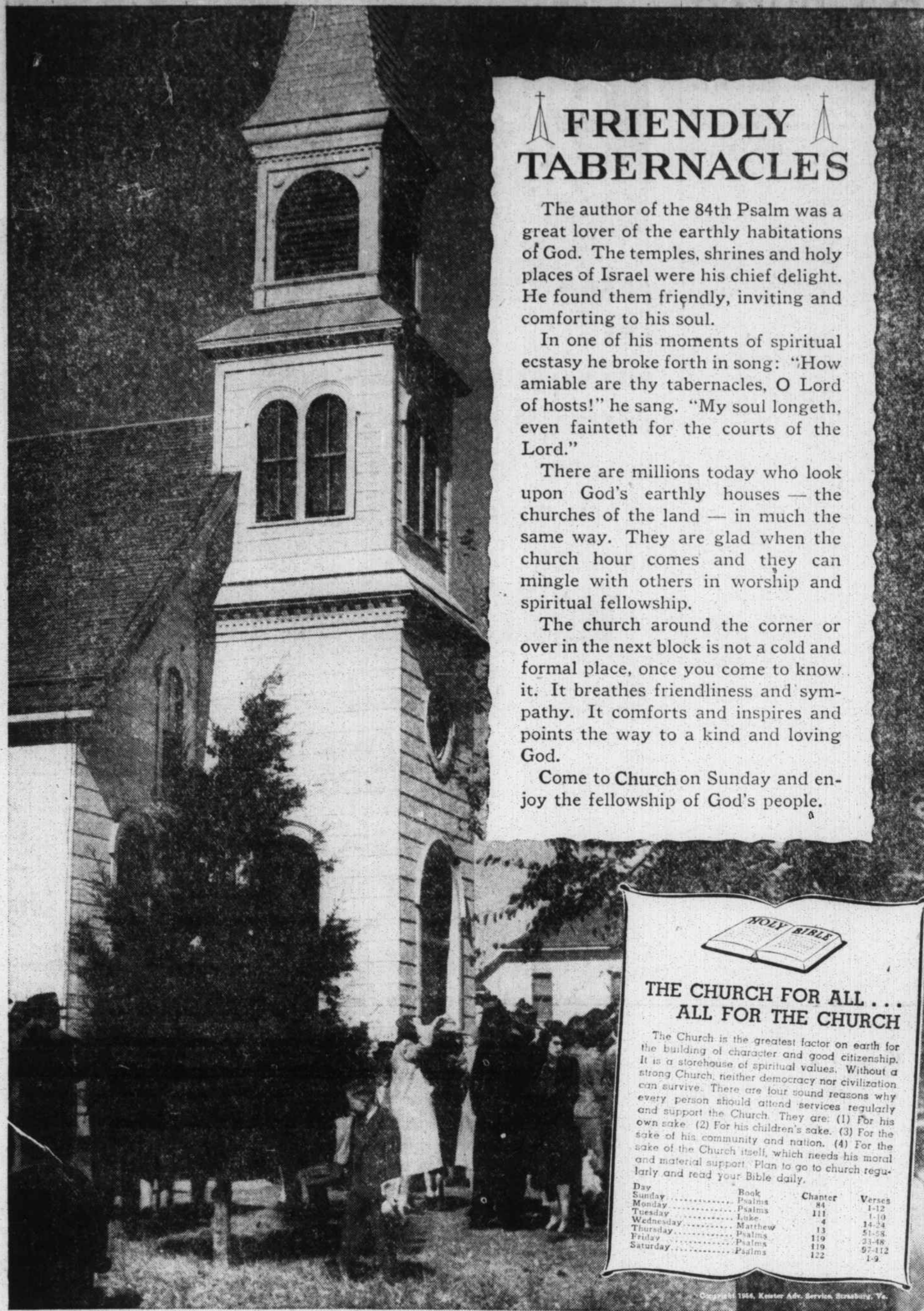
How can people be unkind to little children? Occasionally, we read in our newspaper of a parent who beat a child so severely that the child had to be hospitalized and sometimes died.
