Legion Announces Speaking Contest; \$8,000 In Awards

Plans for staging the 20th Annual American Legion Oratorical Contest in the high schools of North Carolina have been announced by Charles H. Grove of Hickory, Department Oratorical Committee Chairman.

Grove said that all preliminary arrangements were completed this week and that the Contest this year will eclipse all previous efforts in the State. It is estimated that 2,000 high school students participated in the Contest last year.

Students participate in contests

through County, District, Division, State and National competition under American Legion sponsorship. The National winner receives a \$4,000 college scholarship; second place National winner receives a \$2,500 college scholarship; third place National winner receives a \$1,000 college scholarship, and 4th place National winner receives a \$500 college scholarship.

Each school participating will select a representative to enter the County Contest on or before February 11, 1957. The North Carolina State Finals contest will be held on March 8, 1957.

Chairman Grove said that these contests are a National Americanism activity of The American Legion. The subject used must be on some phase of the Constitution of the United States which will give emphasis to the attendant duties and obligations of a citizen of our government.

The Western district conference of the North Carolina School Boards Association will meet at Western Carolina College on Wednesday, October 3, it has been announced by Chairman W. B. Harrill.

The theme for this year's conference is "Preserving, Strengthening and Improving our Public Schools". Robert E. Giles of Raleigh, assistant attorney-general, will deliver the afternoon address. Senator William Medford of Waynesville will speak at the banquet, which is to be held in McKee School cafeteria at 6 p.m.

Harrill said that registration will begin at 2 p.m. in the lobby of Hunter Library, and the first general session is scheduled for 2:30 in the gallery. Group discussions will be led by Mrs. Don R. Printz of Asheville, James T. Fain of Hendersonville, and Robert Barnes of Candler.
