## Feeder Calf Sale Slated Wednesday

A Western North Carolina Feeder Calf Sale will be held at the WNC Livestock Yards in Asheville Wednesday, according to County Agent Virgil L. Holloway.

The sale is for steers and heifers of beef breeding, one year of age or less, and weighing a minimum of 300 pounds, Mr. Holloway explained. Animals also must be dehorned, he added.

All livestock to be sold must be brought to the stockyards between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. Tuesday. The sale will start at 1 p.m. Wednesday.
