

# Election Of Congressmen Important To Both Parties

## NOTICE OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF WAYNESVILLE TO EXTEND ITS CORPORATE LIMITS

All persons owning property within the area hereinafter described, and all qualified voters residing within the area hereinafter described, proposed to be annexed by the Town of Waynesville, and all qualified voters residing within the corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville will take notice that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Waynesville will meet on Wednesday, November 14, 1956, at three o'clock P. M. at the Town Hall in the Town of Waynesville for further consideration of adopting ordinance for the extension of the corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville to include within the said corporate limits the following boundary or area, namely:

**BEGINNING** at a stake at a street intersection at the Southeast corner of Lot No. 1, in Block "G" and runs thence with the Southwesterly margin of Sylvan Drive N. 49° 30' W. 825 feet to a stake at the N. W. corner of Lot No. 10 in said Block "G"; thence S. 40° 30' W. 350 feet to a stake in Noland line, corner of Lots Nos. 17 and 18 in Block "F"; thence with said Noland line (now Reinertson) S. 49° 30' E. 600 feet to a stake at the S. E. corner of Lot No. 29, and the S. W. corner of Lot No. 30; thence S. 30° 15' W. 172 feet to a stake; thence S. 33° E. 64 1/2 feet to a stake in the Noland-Sloan line (now Smathers-Reinertson line); thence N. 67° E. 208 feet with said line to a stake at or near the branch; thence down the branch in an Easterly direction with said Smathers line about 300 feet to a stake; said stake being S. 8° E. from the beginning; thence N. 8° W. 125 feet to the BEGINNING, and being and including Lots Nos. 1 to 28 inclusive, (all of Block "G" and Lots Nos. 18 to 36 and about half of 37 inclusive in Block "F" of Chestnut Park Addition to the Town of Waynesville as per map recorded in Map Book "A" page 94, and also including a small lot at a spring conveyed in a deed from Reeves Noland.

WASHINGTON — Recent Congresses have seen a close numerical division between Democrats and Republicans. The 84th Congress consisted of 49 Democrats and 47 Republicans.

### CLOSE DIVISION

The general election on November 6, will determine the make-up of the Senate for the next two years. Of course deaths and resignations can change the political complexion of a Congress when the balance is so close.

Recently I studied a pamphlet on information about the political division of the Senate during the past century. The facts were interesting.

### A CENTURY

The 34th Congress took its seat in 1855. The nation had a total of 62 Senators at that time compared with the present 96 (two for each state in the Union). Of that total, 42 were Democrats, 15 were Republicans and 5 belonged to other parties. The high water mark for Democratic Senators was in the 75th Congress (1937-39) with a total of 75; that Congress had 17 Republicans and there were 4 Senators listed as belonging to other parties.

### LOWEST EBB

Democratic Senatorial power was at its lowest ebb with only 11 members in the period of the War Between the States and Reconstruction; it was in the 41st Congress that the Republicans had 61 seats, and they also reached their maximum of 61 in the 60th Congress from 1907 to 1909. At the latter date there were 29 Democrats in the Senate.

### RECENT DIVISION

The last Congress to show a considerable political division was the 81st (1949-51) with 14 more Democrats than Republicans. Since that time (the 82nd, 83rd and 84th) the political division has been very thin numerically. And when the time came to organize the Senate it was necessary for each political party to have every member present.

I will not discuss the political division of the House of Representatives except to say that the present division shows 232 Democrats and 203 Republicans.

The last time either body of Congress was organized due to death was in the 72nd Congress

## Gay Halloween Treats Are Easy To Make, Serve

WHY NOT have a Tricks and Treats pick-up for hungry little ghosts and goblins after they've filled their sacks for the evening?

Make it a repast that takes place while loot is being divided by the group. Or if they are all on their own, they could meet to compare treats.

Most youngsters organize their own costumes. But little tots will need some assistance from Mom. A witch's hat is easy to make and fun to wear, as any little broom rider knows.

Here's how to make it: Start with a large head-fitting cone from cardboard. Secure edges with tape. Cut a large circle of cardboard about 3 inches wider all around than the base of the cone. Place the cone on the circle, squeezing slightly so that the base becomes oval to fit the head. Trace around it with pencil and cut the oval piece out of the brim with a razor or other implement. Cover the cone and brim with aluminum foil, securing with tape. Fit the cone into the brim and tape the two together. Decorate it with stars cut from black mat paper.

Serve a good hot corn and tomato chowder with some pumpkin crackers. Combine one 303 size can of cream style corn with one 303 size can tomatoes, 1 can frozen potato soup and frankfurters. You can get the tiny ones in the can or cut up the large size hot dogs. Add one soup can of water, heat through and serve the youngsters in mugs. This recipe should make 6 bowls or 8 mugs of soup. Spread round crackers with processed cheese and decorate them with slices of stuffed olives and green pepper. If you have time cut out bits of the olives and peppers to make a pumpkin face over the cheese.
