All persons who will be out of the county on November 6, or know they will be unable to get to the polls, can make application for an absentee ballot, in person or through a near relative. Deadline is Sunset, Nov. 3, Persons becoming indisposed between sunset Nov. 3, and election day, can make application by filing physician's certificate of illness of voter.
