Registration Books OPEN SATURDAY AND WILL REMAIN OPEN UNTIL SUNSET SATURDAY, OCTOBER 27

All persons not now registered, must do so in order to vote November 6. Persons must live in a precinct 30 days before being eligible to vote. Registering can be done at the polling places each Saturday, or with the registrar at any time prior to Sunset, October 27th.

Information On Absentee Ballots

Applications for absentee ballots are now being accepted by the board, daily, 9 to 12 and 1 to 5. All persons who will be out of the county on November 6, or know they will be unable to get to the polls, can make application for an absentee ballot, in person or through a near relative. Deadline is Sunset, Nov. 3. Persons becoming indisposed between sunset Nov. 3, and election day, can make application by filing physician's certificate of illness of voter.
