## NOTICE OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF WAYNESVILLE TO EXTEND ITS CORPORATE LIMITS

All persons owning property within the area hereinafter described, and all qualified voters residing within the area hereinafter described, proposed to be annexed by the Town of Waynesville, and all qualified voters residing within the corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville will take notice that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Waynesville will meet on Wednesday, November 14, 1956, at three o'clock P. M. at the Town Hall in the Town of Waynesville for further consideration of adopting ordinance for the extension of the corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville to include within the said corporate limits the following boundary or area, namely:

**BEGINNING** at a stake at a street intersection at the Southeast corner of Lot No. 1, in Block "G" and runs thence with the Southwesterly margin of Sylvan Drive N. 49° 30' W. 825 feet to a stake at the N. W. corner of Lot No. 16 in said Block "G"; thence S. 40° 30' W. 330 feet to a stake in Noland line, corner of Lots Nos. 17 and 18 in Block "F"; thence with said Noland line (now Reinertson) S. 49° 30' E. 600 feet to a stake at the S. E. corner of Lot No. 29, and the S.
