

Smoky Mountains Company Makes Plant Food



Installation of a new large aluminum tank for storage of nitrogen fertilizer solutions was the major operation this year at Smoky Mountains Fertilizer Company. The tank, according to executives, "enables us to give better service to our customers and also makes it possible to manufacture fertilizer in even better mechanical conditions than we have done in the past." Plans for growth are in the air, but

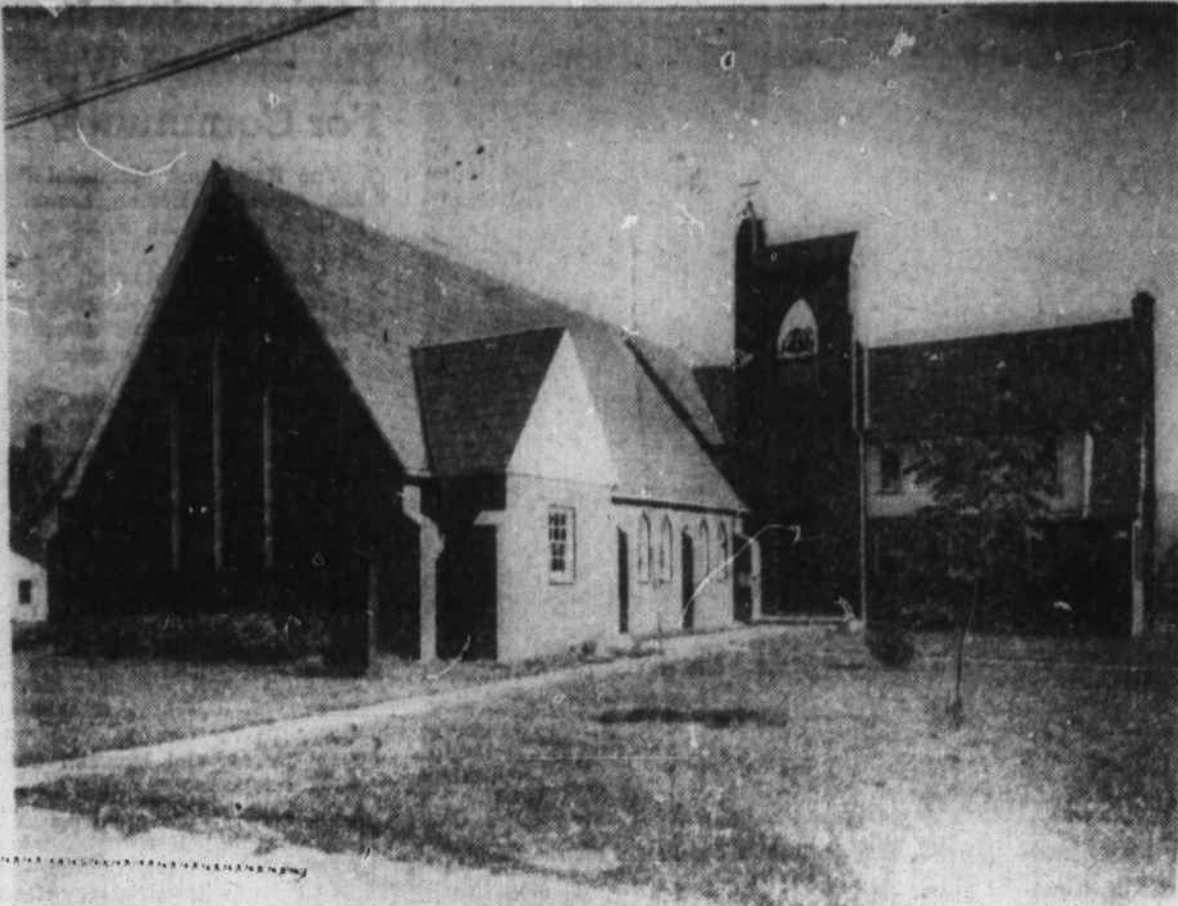
the spokesman reported "nothing definite at this time."

The company requires a maximum of 25 employees to handle the various processes that turn raw material from all over the hemisphere into something that the gardener uses in every quantity from a teaspoonful to a 100-pound sack.

The raw material comes in from widely scattered points. Nearby Tennessee and Virginia

furnish some; Kentucky, Florida, Louisiana and Michigan are suppliers; New Mexico and California contribute their share; and nitrate of soda must come all the way from the tip of South America, from Chile.

Hazelwood Presbyterians Have Fine Program Under Way In Evangelism

Last summer the Hazelwood Presbyterian Church started a long-range and thoroughly planned program of evangelism, teaching and preaching. Special speakers were contacted, and plans have been made for as far as two years in advance.

The program had its inception with a new pastor, the Rev. W. H. Marquis, graduate of Morris Harvey College, with prior work in the University of Cincinnati, and also a graduate of Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Ga.

Last summer the Rev. John H. Knight of the First Presbyterian Church in Smyrna, Ga., conducted revival services, and this spring the leader was the Rev. W. C. Cooper, of the Arden Presbyterian Church.

Miss Mary Lee Smith, a student at the Assembly Training School in Richmond, Va., served this summer as Director of Christian Education. Also during the summer months, the young people of the Church invited James Smith, ministerial student of Kanawha Presbytery, to hold a Youth Crusade. During the week of services, 18 young people made decisions. The summer was concluded with a study of the Book of Deuteronomy, conducted by Dr. Manfred George Gutzke, professor of English Bible at Columbia Theological Seminary. Dr. Gutzke came at the invitation of the Women of the Church.

provements over the past year have been keeping pace with the spiritual growth. The church has added three new class rooms. A brand-new nursery has been completely furnished by the Men of the Church, who partitioned the rooms, and Elmer Dudley, who made the beds, and play pens for the nursery. G. C. Summerrow made two tables, and all the men of the Church contributed of their time and talents in

bringing this work to completion. A new \$4500 Wurlitzer organ was installed during the year, and dedication services were held in September. The organ was purchased as a memorial to Harry R. (Blue) Robinson.

Last summer the church membership totaled 119—today the membership is 139, an increase of 20.3 per cent. Nineteen of these 29 new members were received on profession of faith and ten by transfer of letters.

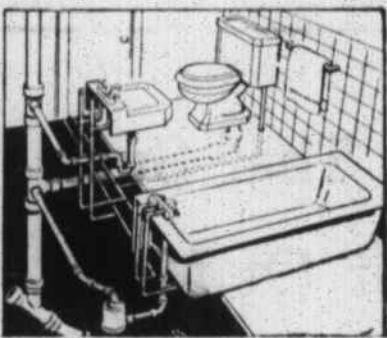
