Waynesville Victor By 20-0 Score

The Waynesville Mountaineers got back on the credit side of the ledger for the 1956 grid season Friday night by trouncing the Rutherfordton-Spindale Central Hilltoppers, 20-0, on a muddy WTHS field before a few hundred dyed-in-the-wool fans.

When the Gold and Black pushed cross two touchdowns, the game ended to be a bit on the dull side. Jerry Nichols recovery of a Hilltopper fumble on the R-S Central 25, in the first quarter, set up the first Waynesville score. It came three plays later when the Mountaineers lined up in their old short punt formation to convey Carroll Hooper around right end for a touchdown. Hugh Grasty plunged over for the extra point.

As the first half ended, the Hilltoppers drove to the Waynesville 30, their deepest penetration of the entire game.

Waynesville received the second-half kickoff and returned the ball to their 38. Grasty rammed through the line for eight yards, and on the next play Neal Palmer found a hole through the R-S Central right tackle slot and sprinted 54 yards for the touchdown. Grasty again added the extra point on a line plunge.

The Mountaineers' third and final touchdown of the evening came from a drive that started on the WTHS 44. After Palmer Grasty, and Hooper picked up four first downs in moving the ball to the 12. Grasty slid around right end for the six pointer. An attempted plunge for the extra point was halted short of the goal line.

Waynesville threatened twice in the fourth quarter, but drives fizzled out on the 22 and 23-yard lines respectively.

R-S Central took to the air considerably in the last period in an attempt to score, but pass interceptions by Palmer and Hooper thwarted the visitors' efforts.

Although the game was played on a muddy field, no rain actually fell during the contest, and viewing conditions for fans were fairly pleasant.

The Mountaineers will travel to Elizabethton, Tenn. this Friday night, and then return home to face the speedy Owen Horshorn in the season's finale.

Coach Bruce Jaynes said about the Friday night game that "defensive line play was best I've had all year, and also pass defense. Outstanding in the line were Nichols, Davis, Turner, Hall, Sparks, Lewis, Fowler, while Center Jimmy Byrd also played a bang-up game."

"Grasty, Palmer outstanding on offense while Hooper and Holder played a fine defensive game," he continued.

Pro Football End Serves As Georgia Deputy Sheriff

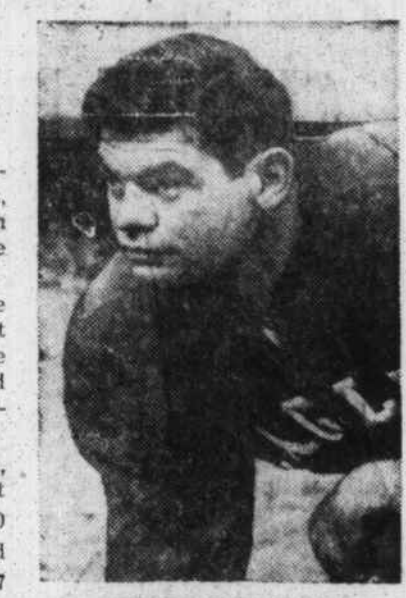
GLENNVILLE, Ga. (AP)—Bobby Walston, star pass catching end of the Philadelphia Eagles of the National Football League, does a different type of catching in the off-season. Walston is a deputy sheriff in Georgia's Tattall county where he catches law violators.

Walston, former University of Georgia star, packs a gun, badge and handcuffs as befits his office. The Eagles apparently are bent on having the law on their side since rookie halfback Billy Conn, no relation to the former fighter, is a full fledged policeman in Newark, N.J.

Since he was appointed deputy sheriff last winter, Walston says he has made about 200 arrests, mostly for traffic violations. His boss, Sheriff Dan Walker, also has taken Bobby with him on moonshine raids "back in the hills".

He says his closest brush came about chasing a speeding motorist who forced him into a ditch where he nearly turned over in his squad car. "But I got out okay and finally caught the guy," he says.

On the football field Walston, in five years as a pro, has caught 156 aeriels for 2,755 yards and 30 touchdowns. Also, he has kicked 146 points after touchdowns and 27 field goals for a total of 407 points.
