

# Adult Training Courses For Scout Leaders Will Start Here Monday Night

A 3-session district Boy Scout Adult Training Course will get under way here Monday, Nov. 5, at the new high school building—room 51.

The course is being sponsored by the Leadership Training Committee of the Pigeon River District, with James Hurley and M. H. Bowles, co-chairmen, and in charge.

The first course on Monday night will be on the subject, "What A Boy Scout Is."

The second session will be on Wednesday, November 7, and the subject will be "Troop Operation," while the third and concluding session will be on Monday, November 12, and on the subject, "Meetings and Activities."

All sessions will begin at 7:30 and continue for two hours.

Any adult will be welcomed to attend any or all sessions, while scoutmasters, parents, assistant scoutmasters, institution representatives and troop committeemen are expected to attend all three, and by doing so will receive a Certificate of Training.

About 25 to 40 people are expected to take the 3-session course.

The faculty for the three sessions will be composed of: Hurley, Bowles, James Anderson, Rudolph Carswell, Harry Whisenant, Francis Pless, and Tom Speed. There are no fees or registration costs for the sessions.

## Miss Drinnon Is Member State CIO Executive Board

Miss Florence Drinnon, Waynesville, is a member of the State CIO executive board, which met in Raleigh this week to discuss the question of merging state organizations of the AFL and CIO.

Conferences will be held in the near future, a CIO official said, according to the Associated Press dispatch from Raleigh.

J. W. Holder of Raleigh, state executive secretary and treasurer, said this after the North Carolina State Industrial Council of the CIO gave its executive board power to put through the merger.

Holder said the resolution adopted by some 250 delegates at the CIO convention will allow the executive board to act on the matter without calling the full council back into session.

A merger agreement drafted and approved by the state boards and the National AFL-CIO was approved by CIO delegates at a convention in Durham last August. Delegates of the AFL rejected the agreement, and named a committee to give it further study.
