The prophet Micah foretold that eventually the house of the Lord would be built on a mountain, and people from many nations would come to it to worship and learn God's will.

Bible Words for Today

I PETER 2:9-10.—"But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, that you may declare the wonderful deeds of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were no people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy but now you have received mercy." (RSV)

From no people to God's people—this is the movement which the Bible displays over and over again. God chose a people of no particular attainments or promise and set them apart as his own.

They are set apart for a special purpose: to tell of God's deeds. This must mean that every Christian community is a mission-station, wherever it is located. Those in darkness are invited to share the light. Those who have not tasted the kindness of the Lord are presented with that kindness.

It is also clear that God's people must be ready to be God's people. They must be recognizably different from those who walk in darkness. Those who have received God's mercy in the Christ must tell of his wonderful deeds and live in the power of them.
