

# Naval Reserve Program Is Open For Local Men

Young men of this area now have the opportunity of becoming members of Naval Reserve Surface Division 6-18 (M) which meets at the reserve center on Merrimon Avenue in Asheville on Tuesday nights.

Men between the ages of 17 and 18½ are eligible to become members of a unit which as part of the Sixth Naval District, finished second in national competition for 1956.

Under the Armed Forces Reserve Act of 1955, all physically fit male citizens of the United States, have an obligated service of six years which may be partially fulfilled as a member of a reserve unit. Other features of the naval reserve include a days pay for each two hour drill, points toward retirement after twenty years and a two weeks training cruise each year which visits many foreign ports enabling reservists to enjoy shore liberty in some of the most famous places in the world.

Division 6-18 (M) also has several billets open for ex-Navy men. These men may be enlisted at the rate they held at the time of their

discharge. All Korean veterans, regardless of rate, may be recruited for one year with the opportunity to change rates at that time in order to qualify for a rate which can be assigned by 6-18(M).


At the meeting Tuesday, the WMU was awarded a certificate for each woman subscribing to the Royal Service magazine.
