# Canton Whips Murphy 41-13 In Grid Playoffs

## Charlotte Team Next For Bears

The Canton Black Bears moved into the second round of the state Class AA football championship playoffs against Charlotte Harding as the result of a 41-13 triumph over the Murphy Bulldogs Friday night on the Western Carolina College gridiron.

Downstate, Charlotte Harding advanced toward the title by clobbering Winston-Salem Gray, 52-12. At Cullowhee the Blue Ridge champions were in command all the way against their Smoky Mountain Conference opponents except in the third period when two Canton fumbles set up Murphy's only touchdowns. The second half was played in a drizzle of rain.

The Black Bears scored the first time they got their clutches on the pigskin by driving from their own 29 to the Murphy six in 13 plays and then sending David Burch in to the end zone. Charles Duke then came out to kick the first of five extra points.

Billy Stamey romped 52 yards with a punt return later in the first period, but the run was called back and Canton penalized for clipping. However, moments later

Stamey burst through a hole at left tackle and sprinted down the sidelines 50 yards for the touchdown.

A long pass sparked a Murphy drive early in the second quarter to the Canton six, but Hill fumbled at that point and Dale Branson recovered for the bears. Eleven plays later, Canton, marched to the Bulldogs' four and Wiley Carpenter plunged over for his team's third touchdown. Duke's placekick was no good and the half ended at 20-0.

With rain falling in the third quarter, Canton backs found it difficult to hold on to the ball and lost two fumbles that enabled Murphy to narrow the count to 20-13. The first Bulldog score came after Hendrix recovered Stamey's fumble on the Canton 24. After Hill lost three, Birchfield passed to Hendrix on the 22, and then O'Dell went off guard for the touchdown. O'Dell also ran the extra point over.

Shortly after Murphy kicked off, Bobby Pace of Canton fumbled and Charles Smith recovered for Murphy on the Canton 15. The Bulldogs advanced the ball to the two, and then sent O'Dell over the goal line again.

However, the Black Bears came to life on the next kickoff and drove 59 yards for a touchdown, with Burch picking up the final 17.

The bears added two more insurance touchdowns in the fourth quarter on an 80 yard march, climaxed by Stamey's 29-yard sprint, and another advance of 56 yards, with Stamey passing to Jim Mathis for 39 yards and a six-point.

In rushing, Canton had a big edge with 23 first downs to Murphy's six and 387 yards rushing to Murphy's 55. The Bulldogs, however were better passers—completing 10 of 18 for 155 yards, while the Black Bears picked up 92 yards on four completions out
