was one of two speakers at an "Action for Hungary" rally at Davidson College Wednesday.

Dr. Szentivanyi and his family escaped from Budapest just ahead of Soviet troops in World War II, leaving on a train bearing the Hungarian national treasury to a place of safe-keeping in Austria. The Szentivanyis, who now live at 404 Richland St., have been in Waynesville since 1950. Dr. Szentivanyi is an accountant with offices in both Waynesville and Canton.

The other speaker on the Davidson College program escaped only recently from Hungary, and was not identified for security reasons. Purpose of the rally was to

launch the 1956 Davidson gift fund, which annually raises more than \$5,000 for a worthy cause.

The students voted unanimously last week to use the gifts this year to bring a Hungarian refugee family to the Davidson community.

The college will provide work for the family's head, and the portion of the gift fund not used for the family's passage will go toward a home in Davidson.

Dr. Roland Elliott of the Church World Service in New York has been instructed to obtain a family group suitable for the Davidson community.

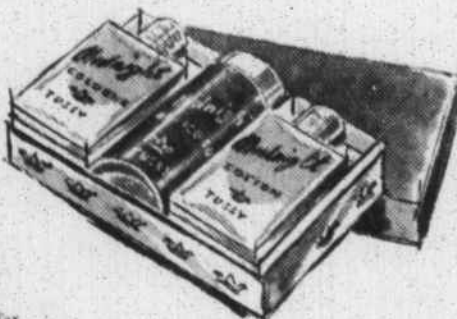
