

# Five Haywood Cage Teams Set For Action Tuesday

## Brevard In Conference Tilt Here

Three high school basketball games are scheduled to be played in Haywood County gyms Tuesday night—involving five of the six county teams.

Waynesville will play its first Blue Ridge Conference game of the season when Brevard invades the WTHS domain tomorrow night. Bethel will go to Crabtree for a twin bill, and Fines Creek will journey to Clyde for a pair.

Canton High, which was scheduled to open basketball practice today, will play its first game of the season Friday against Lee Edwards at Asheville.

The Mountaineers will take their 2-1 record into the fray Tuesday night against the Blue Devils, who are 1-1 for the season. Brevard won its opener against Mills River, 40-33, on last Friday night to Etowah, 44-42.

The Brevard girls have lost both their games thus far—26-21 to Mills River, and 38-29 to Etowah.

The Waynesville boys have lost to Murphy, and have won over Fines Creek and Crabtree. The Waynesville girls whipped Murphy, were tied by Fines Creek, and then defeated Crabtree in their last game Friday night.
