The nearest passenger rail service to Deep Valley, Calif., is Las Vegas, Nev. (140 miles away). Planes and buses do the shuttle service.

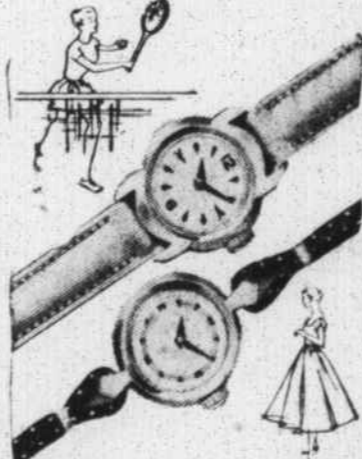
Roy Callahan President Of Shenandoah Band
